

Welwyn Garden City Launches 'Tap to Donate' Scheme to Tackle Homelessness

On average, one household becomes homeless every two minutes in the UK. For residents and visitors in Welwyn Garden City, it's not always clear how to best support those who are begging or sleeping rough.

In response, the Welwyn Garden City Business Improvement District (BID), with the support of Welwyn Hatfield Borough Council, has introduced a simple yet effective solution: 'Tap to Donate' stations. These contactless donation points make it easy for anyone to contribute directly to trusted local charities that work tirelessly to support vulnerable individuals in the community.

How It Works

The three Tap to Donate stations are located at local businesses that are committed to the supporting the initiative to help end homelessness in WGC town centre

- Sixth Circle Tattoo and Piercing Lounge on Church Road
- Howden Insurance on Stonehills
- Londis on Howardsgate

With just a tap of your card, you can donate £3, the cost of a small coffee, to make a meaningful difference in someone's life.

Funds raised will be divided equally among three incredible local charities Herts Young Homeless, Mind in Mid Herts and Resolve.

These charities provide a wide range of support, including homelessness prevention, mental health services, and substance misuse treatment, ensuring that every donation has a direct and tangible impact on the community.

Supporting the Local Community

"This scheme allows shoppers and visitors to Welwyn Garden City to safely tap their card at any of the donation points, confident that their generosity will go directly to three local charities working to tackle homelessness within the community," said Mounia Le Gaufey, Chair of the WGC BID.

Councillor Sandreni Bonfante, WHBC Executive Member for Environment added: "When you see someone asking for money, it's often difficult to know how best to help, or if they are genuinely in need. By donating through 'Tap to Donate,' rather than giving directly to individuals, you can have a far greater impact and help those most in need."
